



Training to teach at Angel Islington Teaching School Alliance

Trainees 2020 / 2021

Teaching is a rewarding career. You will work with young people and help them on their journey to becoming successful individuals and global citizens who have the knowledge, skills and resilience to build the future. Everything we do across our alliance is based on our shared values. All young people can achieve in whatever field they chose, regardless of starting point or background. Train with us, be part of their journey and make a difference. There are several routes into teaching. We offer:

PGCE Route – Tuition Fee (School based)

This is a course where you pay fees to a university (we work with both University College London Institute of Education (UCL IOE) and London Metropolitan University (LMU)). Successful trainees gain Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) and Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE). Information and application can be found on the DfE “Get into Teaching” website:

We offer courses in Primary, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geography, Modern Foreign Languages, English and Maths.

Trainees spend a few days in their placement 1 school in September and then spend a few weeks at university before returning to placement 1 in late September/early October.

Secondary trainees have 2 placements. Primary trainees have a different placement structure.

Our key to success is the high quality mentoring, observations and feedback trainees receive. Trainees start by observing lessons, and then teach part of a lesson, building up until they are teaching classes and have a timetable of their own. Trainees also have alliance based professional studies training 1 afternoon per week.

Selection is by interview at a partner school. This includes being observed delivering a lesson/part of a lesson. Candidates who are successful at this interview will be recommended to a university for a second interview. Choosing a school based approach to training means you have a smaller, more personalised support network whilst training and can build connections that can support you throughout your career.

Graduate Teaching Apprenticeship (GTA):

This is a paid route into teacher training. It is aimed at existing employees who are stepping up within their school to train as teachers. Trainees are employed as unqualified teachers.

The employer pays the university fees (the employer can claim back the fees if they are a levy paying school).

Successful candidates gain Qualified Teacher Status (QTS), Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) and a Graduate Apprenticeship.

Trainees will be teaching in their school from the first day in September and will be responsible for the learning and progress of their own classes. There will be 1 day per fortnight training at London Metropolitan University, with tasks to complete in school between sessions. Trainees will have a school based mentor and University tutor. The University tutor will work with trainees on their yearly training plan.

Our Primary Graduate Apprenticeship is designed for staff wanting to train to be a teacher, who are employed as an unqualified teacher and have the full support of their Headteacher. This is ideal for Teaching Assistants (TAs) and Higher Level Teaching Assistants (HLTAs) who are working in a school and are stepping up to fill a teaching vacancy.

Our Secondary Graduate Teaching Apprenticeship is a route into teaching for graduates in support roles in schools, who are stepping up into a teaching post in their current school and have the full support of their Headteacher, as well as career changers/graduates that have secured employment as an unqualified teacher, and have the support of their Headteacher to take part in high quality teacher training. Secondary apprentices are in school 4 days per week. They spend 1 day per fortnight at London Metropolitan University and 1 day a week subject training across the alliance.
